Manuscript Deadlines

- February/March: Fibromyalgia and Chronic Fatigue Syndrome:** Chemical sensitivity disorder. Treatments for chronic pain and cognitive dysfunction. Exposure to organic chemicals with laboratory diagnostics. Detoxification and cleansing programs. Are anti-depressants and other drug therapies beneficial for fibromyalgia? Why does exercise worsen fatigue states? **November 9, 2007**
- April: Autism and Attention Deficit Disorder:** Epidemic numbers with unexplained cause. Is vaccine etiology valid? The connection to toxic chemicals and metals and need for chelation? Chelation in children versus adults. Juvenile autism treatment protocols. The Lyme Disease connection to autism? **January 4, 2008**
- May: Seasonal Allergies and Bronchial Asthma:** Inhalant allergies to tree pollens, weeds, grasses, animal danders, molds and dust mites. Injection desensitization versus non-injection desensitization. Environmental allergy treatment: Phenol desensitization. Food allergies, food contamination, and food additives. Food quality control testing. **February 1, 2008**
- June: Exercise and Cardiovascular Disease:** Fitness programs and aerobic training. The benefit of weight lifting versus jogging. Doping to improve exercise performance, detection of doping, and strategies to improve performance without doping. Coronary artery disease and prevention of heart failure. Cholesterol control without drugs. Optimal diet: Prudent heart diet versus Atkins diet. **March 7, 2008**
- July: Travel Health and Treating Emergencies in the Woods:** Vaccinations for third world travel? Malaria and hepatitis prophylaxis. A medical kit to take along for travel in the bush or out-on-sea. Herbal and homeopathic approaches for insect bites, skin rashes, burns, injuries and infections. Special Case: Airplane health – best approaches to survive the flight and counter jet lag. Bird flu and tick-borne disease. **April 4, 2008**
- August/September: Annual Cancer Issue: Breast, Colon and Prostate Cancer:** Alternative cancer treatment clinics diagnostics, therapeutics, and protocols. Mind-body therapies and cancer support groups. Hyperthermia localized and systemic. Using chemotherapy, radiation and hormone therapies with anti-oxidants and herbals. Rationale for using conventional versus alternative therapies. Dietary strategies to prevent cancer. **May 9, 2008**
- October: Skin Disease – Eczema and Psoriasis:** Allergy based skin disorders. Food allergy testing and dietary treatment. Chronic skin disorders and alternatives to corticosteroid therapies. Skin Cancer and melanoma. Essential fatty acid supplementation: Omega-6 versus Omega-3 fats. Vitamin D research. The role of yeast and parasite in skin disorders. Staph-based skin infection and their new virulence. **July 3, 2008**
- November: Auto-immune disease and Lupus:** Systemic lupus erythematosus, rheumatoid arthritis, juvenile diabetes and bullous dermatologic disorders. Immune system dysfunctioning. Diagnostic antibody studies. Genetic and familial disorders. Infection and inflammation etiologies. Exposure to chemicals and toxins in auto-immune disorders. **August 1, 2008**
- December: Hypothyroidism and Adrenal Deficiency Disorders:** Hypothyroidism and thyroiditis. Depression secondary to hypothyroidism. Failure of laboratory testing to diagnose hypothyroidism. Broda Barnes' treatment with Armour Thyroid versus use of levothyroxine. Natural hydrocortisone as treatment for low-grade adrenal deficiency. Laboratory testing for thyroid and adrenal deficiency disorders. **August 29, 2008**
- January: Alternative Laboratory Testing:** Functional medicine evaluation. Anti-aging studies. Food allergy and digestive stool analysis diagnostics. Toxic element testing: the state of the art. Antibody studies to monitor inflammation, infection, toxic metal or chemical exposure. Amino acid profiles and neurochemistry panels. The need for laboratory diagnostics for naturopathic diagnosis and treatment. **October 3, 2008**
